One of the main concerns about the fabric of the church buildings arose in January 2022 when the alarm system failed and the subsequent inspection revealed a rat infestation in the roof space of the Jubilee Rooms. Rentokill inspectors were employed to make regular inspections and all gaps in the roof were filled. Their last inspection was at the end of last year and since then no rats have been found.

On a positive note we now have two beautiful new gates which have been made by Chris Kemp – our thanks to Chris - and two bike racks fitted to the wall of the Jubilee Rooms. We have also purchased a bench which will be fitted to the ground near to the notice board by the north gate. This will be of help to those who are waiting for lifts by the gate at the end of services.

Our thanks also go to members of the audio-visual team who have taken over the job of programming the heating systems for the church and the Jubilee Rooms.

We have experienced some problems during the year including leaves on the church roof causing leaks in the church, damp patches on the Jubilee Rooms porch roof and problems with one of the inner doors to the Jubilee Rooms. All these issues have been or are in the process of being dealt with by members of the committee and others.

Every five years we have a Quinquennial Inspection by an architect from Lichfield Diocese and he makes a detailed report which provides the background to much of what has to be done to the fabric of our building. During the last 12 months we have been mindful of the recommendations made in the previous report of 2018 in the knowledge that this year we shall be having another inspection. Many of the tasks detailed can be done by members of the committee or other church members but others must be done by outside contractors. Much of the recommended work has been completed and the committee keeps a list of all necessary inspections of appliances and utilities, when completed and by whom. The latest summary was produced in March.

Obviously much of this work costs money and Richard Humphrey who manages the Christ Church finances reports back at each Fabric and Finance meeting to let us know the current situation. We are all aware of current rising costs in our personal lives and these have affected our church as well. Prices of gas and electricity, together with costs to stationery, candles etc. have all increased. Thanks to the continuing generosity of our congregation, increased fees for room hirers and income from events organised by our social committee we are in a stable position financially. Our thanks go to Richard and the financial team for all their hard work. I should also say thank you to Rev Phil and all the members of the Fabric and Finance team who continue in their dedicated work to keep our lovely church in as good condition as possible.
